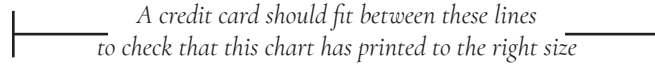


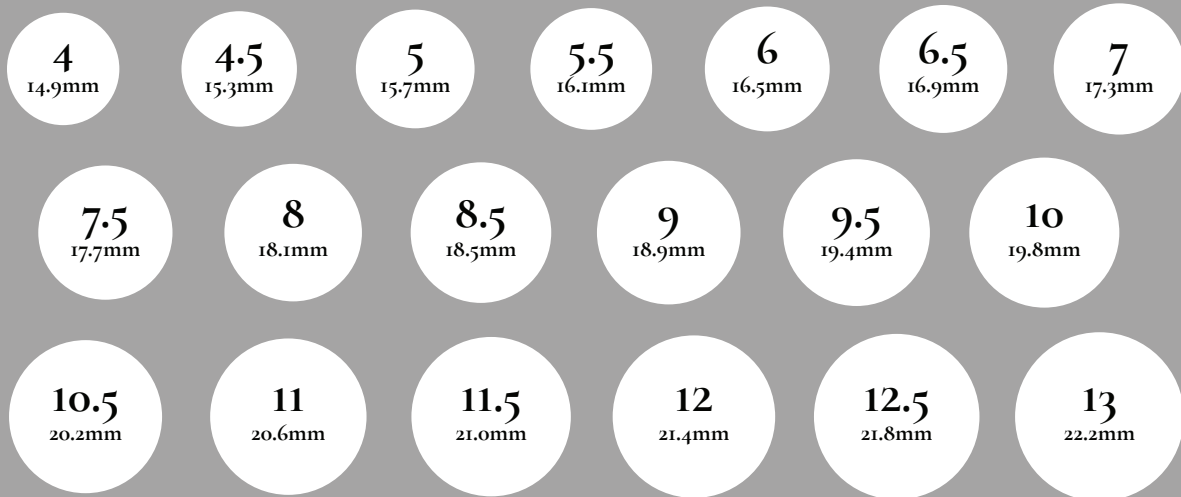
Ring Size Guide

Before measuring your ring size, be sure this guide is printed in **A4 Paper size** and scaled to 100%. You can check the accuracy of your print by positioning a credit card on the line below.



Option 1: Measure By Matching A Ring

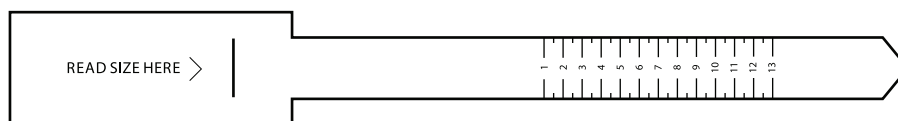
To find your ring size, use an existing ring that fits you well. Match the inside of that ring with one of the circles below. When your ring has been placed on the right size, you should see only the white circle—with no colored space—inside your ring. If your ideal fit falls between two sizes, we recommend choosing the larger size or requesting a quarter size between both.



WARNING: Comfort Fit Profile rings may be harder to size. We recommend using a standard profile ring or using the second method to find your ring size.

Option 2: Measure By Paper Ring Sizer

After you cut out the ruler, carefully cut the line to create the slit. Wrap the ruler around the base of your finger and pull the end through the slit. The paper should be snug but not tight. We recommend also measuring your knuckle to ensure a good fit. Pull the paper tight on the knuckle to measure. If the size is much larger contact us for fitting suggestions.



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
